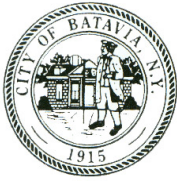

2010 Batavia Police Department Annual Report

The Batavia Police Department 2010 annual report has been updated to provide a more comprehensive representation of the police department's activities. These statistics cannot totally measure the efforts of all the members of the police department, which operates 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The police department's goal is to ensure the safety of the residents of our community and to provide the best possible police services.

This annual report includes highlights of major incidents and events for 2010. Crime statistics and averages have been included for Part I & II crimes. The Part I crime statistics are represented as the number of incidents per 1,000 of population. Because of their similarities, Part I crimes are used by the FBI to compare crime rates for communities throughout the United States. Part II crimes can be specific by definition to certain regions and localities and are represented as crimes per 1,000 of population. Also, included in this report is a department flow chart, which represents all the positions in the department whether or not they are currently filled.

I would like to personally thank all the members of the department for their dedicated efforts in 2010. Also I would to thank all the citizens of the community for their support of the Batavia Police Department.

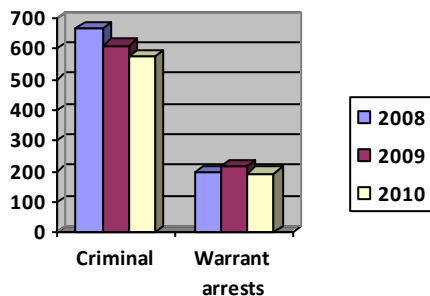
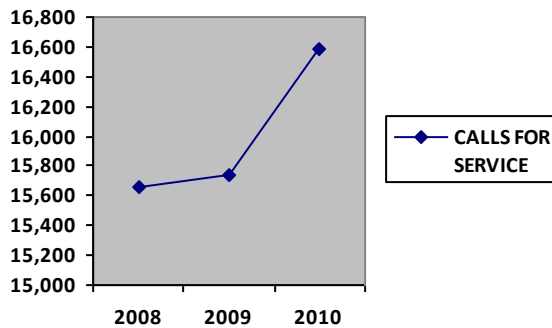

2010 - YEAR END TOTALS

During 2010 members of the Batavia Police Department responded to 16,606 calls for service, logged about 100,000 miles on patrol and performed 1685 hours of training. The police department handled 534 motor vehicle accidents, 98 personal injury reports and 1 fatal accident. There were 575 criminal arrests and 196 warrant arrests.

Training topics for the department included firearms, defensive tactics, Taser, Emergency Response Team, domestic violence, patrol procedures, DWI detection, DNA procedures, and interviewing techniques. The Emergency Response Team traveled to Verona for training with the NYS Tactical Officers Association. The team also competed in a SWAT team competition in Erie County in September.

MAJOR CASES

Several major cases were investigated by the detectives and patrol officers of the department. In February of 2010 a fatal fire occurred on State Street.

In May of 2010 a major fire destroyed the old Wiard Plow Factory on Swan Street causing several hundred thousand of dollars of damage and destroying a major portion of the building. Three juveniles were eventually arrested and sent to family court after an extensive investigation.



Batavia Police Department detectives worked with the Elmira police department in investigating the death of a 15 month old child. The person responsible for poisoning the child was eventually arrested and sentenced to prison.

Detectives worked with the Kansas City Missouri police department to arrest a sex offender in Kansas City who was texting underage females in Batavia.

Several major trials were held in 2010 that resulted in convictions. Dalton Wilkie was convicted on federal charges of soliciting a minor for sex and traveling to Batavia to engage the minor in sexual activity.

Andre Scott was convicted for arson and attempted murder for a fire started in a multi-family residence in 2008.

An investigation resulted in the arrest of a subject for fraudulently obtaining \$58,000.00 from an elderly female.



The drug task force investigated 95 drug cases made 86 arrests and executed 18 search warrants. One drug investigation with the FBI disrupted a major methamphetamine drug ring in Genesee County.

SPECIAL DETAILS

Detectives supervised and registered, on average, over 60 level I, II and III sexual offenders. Two unannounced sexual offender registration checks were conducted in conjunction with NYS parole and the Genesee County probation department. The detectives also conducted a community awareness educational program for the public on the sexual offender program and gave instructions on how to access information on sex offenders in our community. Alcohol sale compliance checks were conducted during March of 2010. These compliance checks targeted establishments where police have received complaints of sale of alcohol to persons underage. All establishments were found to be in compliance.

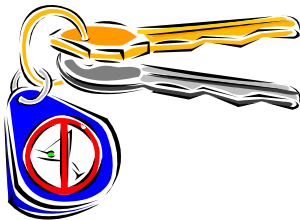
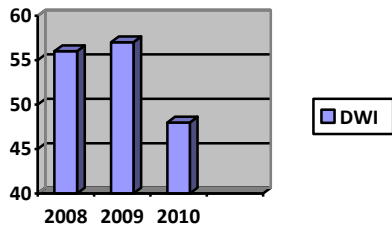
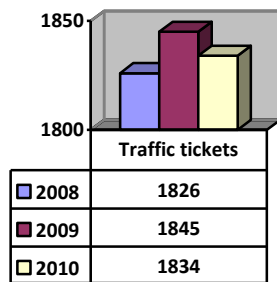
Car seat events were held on three different occasions. A total of 34 car seat inspections were conducted and 9 new car seats were provided to citizens whose car seat did not meet state standards.



TRAFFIC PATROLS

Patrol officers conducted several traffic details that were funded by the NYS Buckle Up New York and STEP program. Also, our local STOP DWI program supported over 400 hours of special DWI patrols which resulted in over 439 vehicles stops and 48 DWI arrests.

A survey of motor vehicle traffic in the city showed that seat belt compliance by operators of motor vehicles was over 90% for the driver of the vehicle.

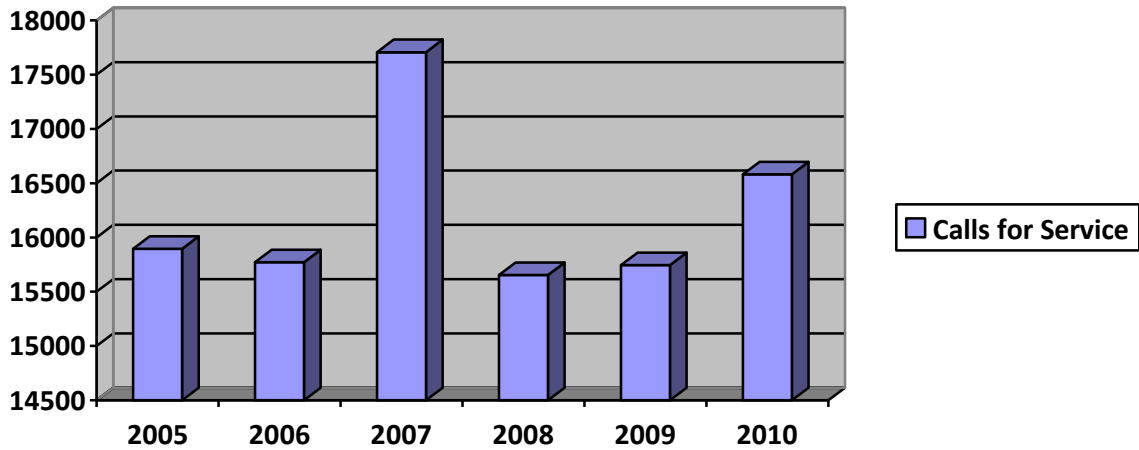

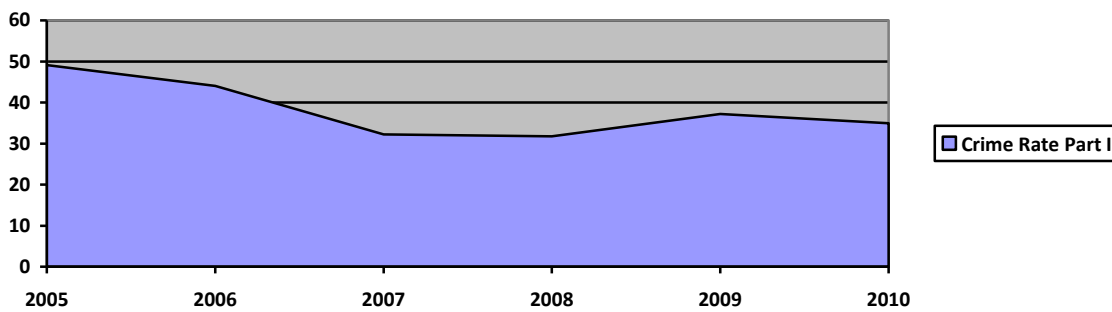
SERIOUS CRIME

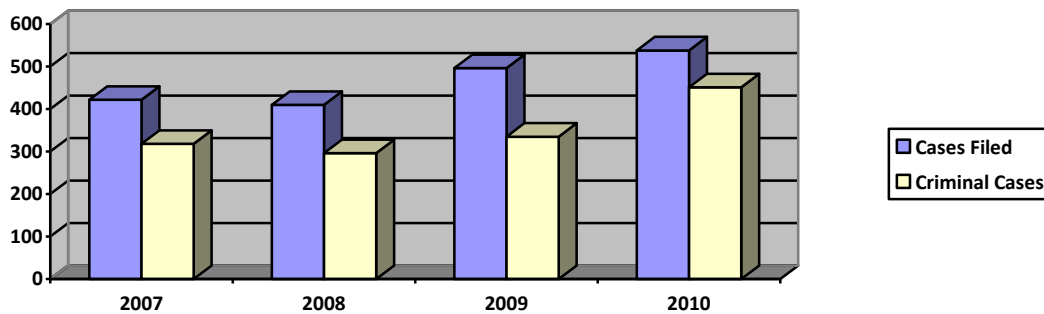

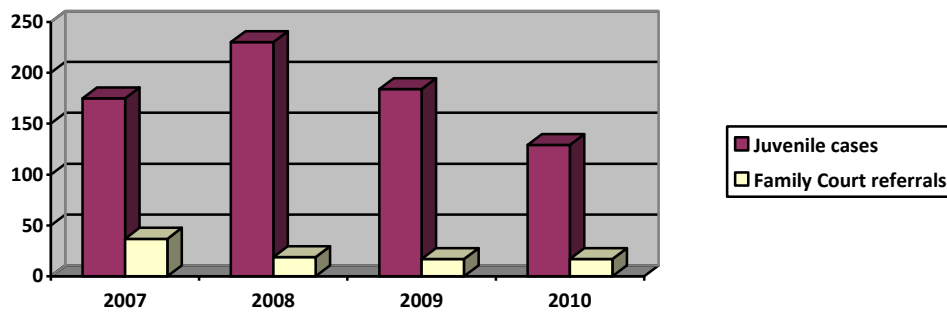

Juvenile Offenses Investigated: Juvenile offenses are offenses reported to the Department where the offender is less than sixteen years of age at the time of the offense.

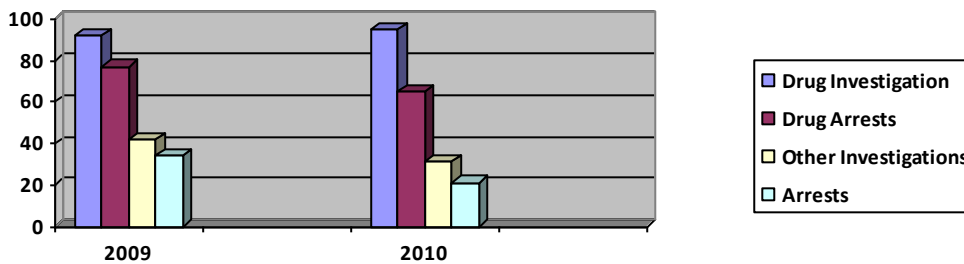

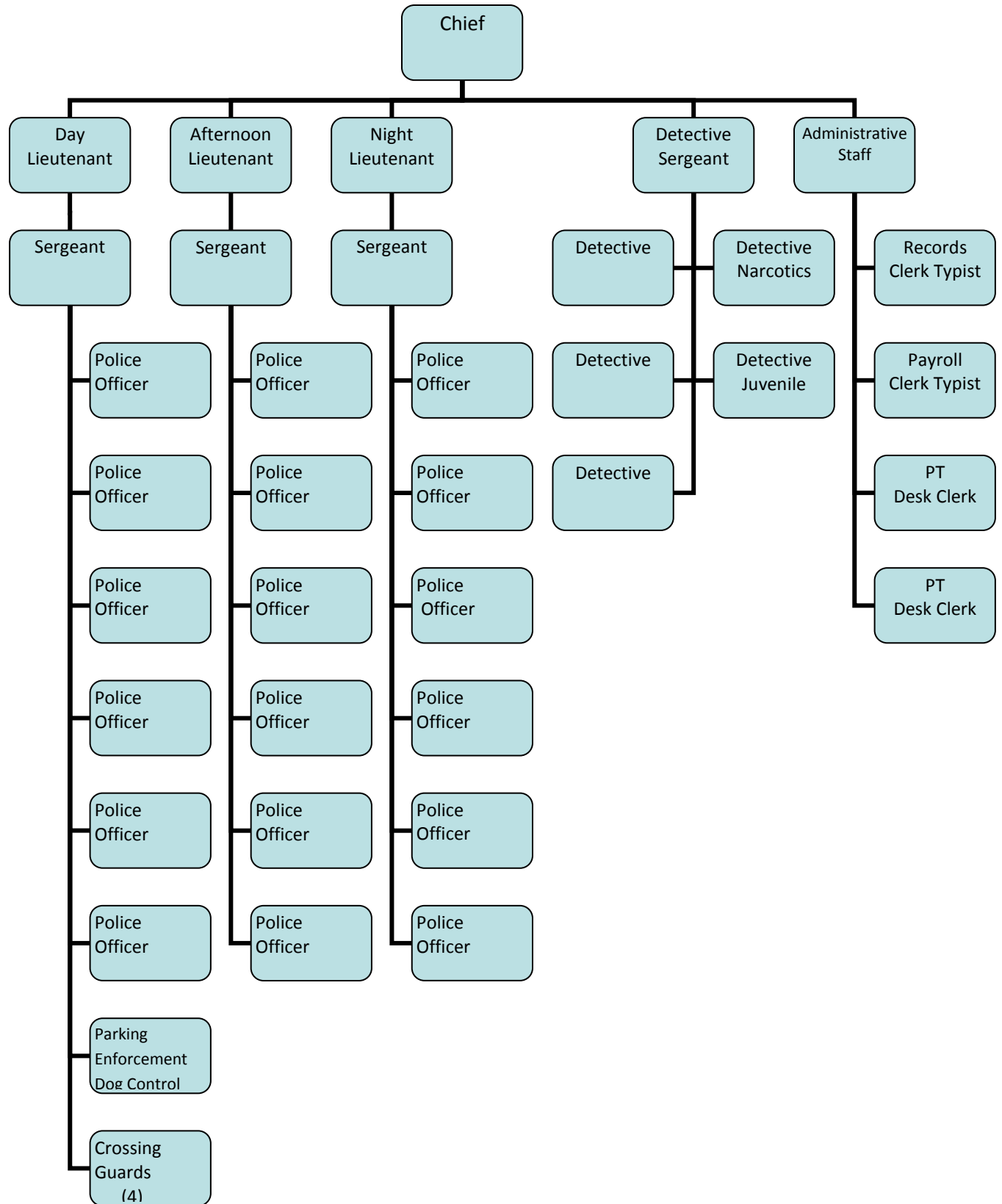

During the past year Officer Camp has demonstrated his professionalism, dedication and service to the community on several complaints. In May of 2009 Officer Camp helped divert a tragedy when he and other members of our department were able to take into custody without injury, a subject who had a mental break down and drove a large piece of farm equipment into the town and city, destroying occupied vehicles on the highway.

In August of 2009 Officer Camp assisted in taking into custody a woman who had threatened suicide and cut her wrists with a large knife.

In November of 2009 Officer Camp was confronted with a distraught mental health patient, an Iraqi War Veteran from the VA Hospital, who was intoxicated and walking in traffic. Even after an unprovoked attack in which the subject attempted to choke Officer Camp, he was taken into custody without serious injury to anyone involved.
