III. Public Hearings:

The Chair opened the public Hearing at 5:07 pm.

Redfield Parkway Pillars – Historical Designation. Kathy Owen, 2 Redfield Parkway, was the first to speak. She explained how the pillars are a heritage to the City. She said that a lot of our heritage has already been lost due to decay and demolition. In 2011 the Genesee Finger Lakes Planning Council stated that the Redfield Parkway district is a cultural significant site. The pillars were originally called or classified as the gateway to the City of Batavia. Ms. Owen also stated that the new Dunkin Donuts that was built across the street from the Redfield Pillars chose to do stone façade on the bottom portion of the building to match the Redfield pillars.

Ms. Owen also received two emails (see attached) from residents in favor of the pillars being designated. Ms. Owen read them into the minutes. One of the emails was from Pam Russell, 29 Redfield Parkway. She stated that she remembers the Redfield pillars from when she was a child. She thinks that they are beautiful and would love to see them last another 100 years.

The second email was from Jim and Brenda Pierce, 15 Redfield Parkway. They stated in their email that they felt it was appropriate that the pillars be designated as a local historical landmark. They gave some history of when the pillars were constructed. They also referenced how the City has lost some of the historical character to fires, urban renewal, and neglect.

Jim Owen, 2 Redfield Parkway, also spoke. He stated the pillars were built in 1912 and the City of Batavia took over the street in 1928. He is in favor of the pillars being designated.

Don Fryling, 6 Redfield Parkway, was the final one to speak regarding the pillars. Mr. Fryling stated that many people have seen the pillars over the years and are in favor of having them designated.

The Chair closed the meeting at 5:23 pm.

IV. Communications Sent and Received: First Baptist Church. The First Baptist Church members asked the commission if there were any grants to help fund the repairs to the church bells. They also discussed items that need to be fixed such as the masonry, the stained glass windows and the bells. The commission was able to give them names of people that may be able to help them.

I believe the fact that the subdivision became a part of the city, with the Pillars already in existence speaks to the fact that the city should, and would want, to take responsibility for the upkeep of this important part of our history. Over the years the city has lost more and more items of historical significance. Some were lost to fire, some to Urban Renewal, and some to neglect. We would hate to see the Redfield Parkway Pillars, an important part of Batavia's history, also lost to neglect. We think it is appropriate that the Pillars be designated as a local historic landmark, and that the city takes the proper pride in maintaining such a landmark.

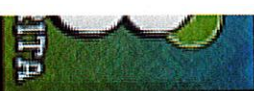
