Dear Mr. Reberholt:

Thank you for requesting the comments of the State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO). We have reviewed the project in accordance with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966. These comments are those of the SHPO and relate only to Historic/Cultural resources.

As you know, the Batavia Veterans Administration Hospital was listed in the National Register of Historic Places in 2012. The buildings involved in this undertaking are classified as contributing features of the listed historic district.

We have reviewed the information submitted, including the August 2011 Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) that was executed to mitigate the loss of building 19. The submitted information states that your agency has made efforts to meet the requirement outlined in Stipulation 1 of the MOA. Before this office can continue consolation on this undertaking, please provide us with documentation of steps taken by your agency, and referenced in your letter, to fulfill the terms of the previous agreement. Please submit copies of maintenance records, building assessments/condition reports, contractor's records, notices of public lease offerings or requests for proposals for reuse that have been undertaken in the past years.
