#### I. Roll Call

Roll call of the members was conducted. Five members were present.

#### II. Call to order

Chair Sharon called the meeting to order at 5:01 p.m.

## III. Previous Meeting Minutes

There were no corrections to the minutes. The minutes were approved as written by unanimous consent.

# IV. Proposals

A. <u>Proposal to remove existing shingle roof to the deck and legally dispose of the material.</u> <u>Install 100% ice and water shield, 40-year BP Architectural shingles with 6 nails per shingle, and all related flashings, in like and same kind.</u>

# 1. Review Application for Completeness

Ms. Burkel noted that the board had not received any information regarding the color or the material of the roof. Mr. Panek pointed out the Mr. Bono had originally intended to replace the roof in kind, but the same color was not available.

Mr. Bono had brought a book with information about the roof for the board to look at. He indicated that the name of the color he had selected for the shingles is called "Weathered Wood."

The board determined that the application was complete.

#### 2. Public Hearing

Ms. Burkel opened the public hearing at 5:05 p.m. There was no one present who wished to speak, and no calls or email had been received concerning the project.

#### 3. Discussion and Action by the Board

Ms. Burkel asked about the timeline for the project, and Mr. Bono responded that they are hoping to begin later in June or early July.

Ms. Green asked if the little peaks on the roof are also going to be re-done. Mr. Bono explained that there are some small areas on the flat parts of the roof as well as the peaks that will be repaired and coated with an illuminizer.

Ms. Burkel asked if the color of the illuminizer would match the color of the roof. Mr. Bono told the board that the flat part will not be visible from the ground, but the peaks might be. He said that if the board is concerned, there is a brown color available that could be used on those areas.

**MOTION**: Ms. Hosek moved to approve the project with the stipulation that the color of the illuminizer that will be use on the flat parts and peaks of the roof will be brown, in order to match the color of the shingles as closely as possible. The motion was seconded by Ms. Green, and all voted in favor.

**RESULT:** Approval with the condition stated above.

B. Proposal to remove the existing basement windows and frames. Install treated framing with 4" x 6" header to carry the weight. Install new white or tan Vinylmax sliding windows with Low-E insulated glass and horizontal grids to match the original sashes. The debris will be cleaned up and hauled away.
