

# **CITY OF BATAVIA BUSINESS MINUTES August 12, 2019**

The regular business meeting of the City Council was held Monday, August 12, 2019 at 8:00 PM in the Council Chambers, One Batavia City Centre, Batavia, New York, with Council President Jankowski presiding.

Present were Council President Jankowski and Councilpersons Pacino, Briggs, McGinnis, Viele, Canale, Christian and Bialkowski. Councilperson Tabelski was absent.

Council President Jankowski called the meeting to order at 8:00 PM immediately following the Conference Meeting.

The financials from June 2019 were approved.

The minutes from the July 2019 meetings were approved.

The Council President assigned the regular agenda items.

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## **City Attorney's Report**

George Van Nest, City Attorney, noted they continue to work on a variety of matters but there was nothing specific to report.

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## **City Manager's Report**

Martin Moore, City Manager, said the City projects were continuing to move along with projects running on schedule. He said he would like to have the projects completed by the time school starts. He also noted that the City's audits were moving along.

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## **Committee Reports**

Councilperson Pacino said that the Beertavia event had gone well. She also noted that there were many events coming up including the Wine Walk and scarecrow competition.

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## **Unfinished Business**

**WHEREAS**, the New York State Department of Criminal Justice Services (NYS-DCJS) has sponsored Crime Analysis Center program participants throughout the State of New York, including Monroe County; and

**WHEREAS**, the Monroe Crime Analysis Center (MCAC) has been a proven resource by providing and disseminating important crime analysis information to participating law enforcement agencies; and

**WHEREAS**, the MCAC has contributed to research, analysis and development of a comprehensive picture of crime incidents through performing in-depth crime analysis, pattern identification, incident mapping and emerging crime trend recognition; and

**WHEREAS**, the Police Department is desirous in participating in the MCAC and becoming a party to the MCAC MOU.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the City Council President for the City of Batavia is hereby authorized to sign a Memorandum of Understanding with the Monroe Crime Analysis Center (MCAC) for the purpose of establishing the Police Department as a party to the MCAC MOU as attached hereto.

**A RESOLUTION TO APPROVE THE USE OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE EQUIPMENT RESERVE FUND FOR CONTINGENCY AND PROJECT MANAGEMENT COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE ENTERPRISE RESOURCE PLANNING SYSTEM (ERP) SOFTWARE SYSTEM CONVERSION PROJECT AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO MAKE THE REQUISITE BUDGET AMENDMENT**

**Motion of Councilperson Bialkowski**

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to General Municipal Law 6-c, the City of Batavia has an established Administrative Equipment Reserve fund that includes in its purpose Information Technology (IT) capital improvement projects; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Batavia Administrative Reserve Fund has an uncommitted balance of approximately \$249,136 with none of this balance committed for use in the 2019-20 budget; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Batavia has authorized a \$750,000 capital project using Bond Anticipation Notes to convert its current financial and city operations software to a new software package (software conversion project), which includes software, hardware, installation, training, project management, and associated costs; and

**WHEREAS**, contingency and project management costs require an additional commitment of approximately \$45,000 beyond the funds available through the \$750,000 Bond Anticipation Note; and

**WHEREAS**, contingency and project management are critical components of the software system conversion project.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the City Council of the City of Batavia does hereby approve the use of \$45,000 from the Administrative Equipment Reserve to cover the

contingency and project management costs as needed for the software conversion project; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, by the City Council of the City of Batavia that the City Manager be and hereby is authorized to make the following budget amendment:

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to General Municipal Law 6-c, the City of Batavia has an established Administrative Equipment Reserve fund that includes in its purpose Information Technology (IT) capital improvement projects; and

**WHEREAS**, assessment work completed in phase one (1) of the Information Technologies Upgrade Capital Project has identified, as its initial phase two (2) recommendation, the replacement of major network computer hardware components and computer technical services necessary for implementation of the computer software conversion project; and

**WHEREAS**, these phase two (2) computer hardware and technical services costs are approximately \$200,000, including installation; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Batavia Administrative Equipment Reserve Fund has an uncommitted balance of at least \$204,136, which is currently uncommitted for use in the 2019-20 budget; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the City Council of the City of Batavia does hereby approve the use of \$200,000 from the Administrative Equipment Reserve to cover computer hardware purchase and computer technical services costs necessary for the computer software conversion project; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, by the City Council of the City of Batavia that the City

Manager be and hereby is authorized to make the following budget amendment:

**A RESOLUTION AWARDING AN ENTERPRISE RESOURCE PLANNING SYSTEM (ERP) SOFTWARE LICENSE AND SERVICES AGREEMENT TO TYLER TECHNOLOGIES AND AUTHORIZING THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT TO SIGN THE AGREEMENT**

**Motion of Councilperson Canale**

**WHEREAS**, the **CITY OF BATAVIA** (the “City”), in the County of Genesee, by its City Council has determined it necessary for the City to purchase and install computer software to implement an integrated enterprise resource planning (ERP) system to utilize best practices, automated workflow, project management tools and other suitable applications (the “Software System”); and

**WHEREAS**, the City has committed the necessary funds for the purchase, installation, and implementation of the software system; and

**WHEREAS**, the City has completed the procurement process in conjunction with its consultants, and has identified Tyler Technologies as a selected company for the purchase, installation, and implementation of major components of the software system. These components include the financial management, payroll and human resource, utility management, and asset management modules as identified in the contract, at a cost of \$651,717 (contingencies included).

**BE IT RESOLVED**, by the City Council of the City of Batavia, Genesee County, New York that a contract titled “system license and services agreement” is awarded to Tyler Technologies and authorizes the Council President to sign the agreement.

**WHEREAS**, the **CITY OF BATAVIA** (the “City”), in the County of Genesee, by its City Council has determined it necessary for the City to purchase and install computer software to implement an integrated enterprise resource planning (ERP) system to utilize best practices, automated workflow, project management tools and other suitable applications (the “Software System”); and

**WHEREAS**, the City has committed the necessary funds for the purchase, installation, and implementation of the software system; and

**WHEREAS**, City staff, in compliance with its procurement process, has identified Client First Technology Consulting as its preferred specialized consultant for overall project management of the software system conversion, at a first year cost not to exceed \$82,003.

**BE IT RESOLVED**, by the City Council of the City of Batavia, Genesee County, New York that the Council President is authorized to sign a one year professional services agreement with Client First Technology Consulting.

**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING ADDITIONAL POLICE OFFICER POSITIONS FOR THE POLICE DEPARTMENT**

**Motion of Councilperson Pacino**

**WHEREAS**, there are anticipated retirements within the Police Department; and

**WHEREAS**, the staffing in the Police Department is critical to public safety and the training of a new police officer can take up to a year to complete; and

**WHEREAS**, the authorization of two (2) additional police officer positions will allow for these new police officers to begin their training ahead of two anticipated retirements, thereby shortening the period of time between a retirement and replacing the retired officer.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Council of the City of Batavia does authorize two (2) additional police officer positions for the Police Department effective immediately.

**A RESOLUTION TO ESTABLISH A DEBT SERVICE RESERVE FOR THE GENERAL FUND**

**Motion of Councilperson Canale**

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to General Municipal Law Section 6-h debt service reserves are established when excess bond funds result upon the completion of a capital project; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Batavia received \$195,500 of bond funding in the 2018/2019 fiscal year for a Caterpillar 938; and

**WHEREAS**, the total actual cost for the Caterpillar 938 issuance costs were \$194,141.30, creating excess bond revenue of \$1,389.04 after interest earned; and

**WHEREAS**, this excess bond revenue must be placed in a Debt Service Reserve for the General Fund to be used first and solely for the payment of debt in that fund.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Council of the City of Batavia that the City's General Fund Debt Service Reserve be established in accordance with General Municipal Law 6-h, and the \$1,389.04 be expended first solely for the payment of debt in the fiscal year ending March 31, 2021.

**A RESOLUTION TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH THE NYS DEPARTMENT OF MOTOR VEHICLES GOVERNOR'S TRAFFIC SAFETY COMMITTEE FOR POLICE TRAFFIC SERVICES AND TO AMEND THE 2019-2020 POLICE DEPARTMENT BUDGET TO REFLECT THE RECEIPT OF A POLICE TRAFFIC SERVICES GRANT**

**Motion of Councilperson Briggs**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Batavia Police Department has received a grant in the amount of \$10,500 from the New York State Governor's Traffic Safety Committee to participate in the statewide Police Traffic Services Program. The goal is to increase seat belt usage and reduce dangerous driving behaviors in an effort to reduce serious injury and death from traffic crashes; and

**WHEREAS**, to properly account for the expenditure of this money, a budget amendment needs to be made.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the City Council President for the City of Batavia is hereby authorized to sign a contract with the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles Governor's Traffic Safety Committee to accept the \$10,500 in grant funding to be used for Police Traffic Services; and

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, the City Manager is hereby authorized to make the following budget amendment to the 2019-2020 budget effective September 10, 2019 to cover various traffic enforcement detail expenses:

**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AN AGREEMENT WITH THE NYS DEPARTMENT OF STATE FOR DOWNTOWN REVITALIZATION INITIATIVE (DRI) GRANT FOR JACKSON SQUARE**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Batavia has received a grant in the amount of \$750,000 from the New York State Department of State for the Downtown Revitalization Initiative Grant to enhance Jackson Square; and

**WHEREAS**, to advance the project a contract to secure the funds is required; and

**WHEREAS**, the contract is from May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2019 to April 30, 2024; and

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, by the City Council of the City of Batavia hereby authorizes the City Council President and City Manager for the City of Batavia to execute all necessary agreements with New York State Department of State to advance the DRI Agreement to enhance Jackson Square in the amount of \$750,000.

**WHEREAS**, the City of Batavia Youth Bureau will have increased expenditures and request to establish the small equipment line to support expenditures associated with our relocation; and

**A RESOLUTION TO EXECUTE A NATIONAL GRID URBAN CENTER/COMMERCIAL DISTRICT REVITALIZATION PROGRAM FOR THE CITY OF BATAVIA CITY CENTRE CAMPUS**

**Motion of Councilperson Canale**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Batavia would like to accept a \$165,000 National Grid Grant for the Urban Center/Commercial District Revitalization Program for The City of Batavia City Centre campus; and

**WHEREAS**, the grant funding will be used to complete a City Centre Campus Feasibility Study that will evaluate the potential for redevelopment of the City Centre Campus, and for construction related to the City Centre and specifically 35 City Centre; and

**WHEREAS**, the grant is a 3:1 matching grant that will be matched with several other sources of funding including the New York State Empire State Development (NYS ESD) Feasibility Grant, the City of Batavia City Centre Capital Project, the NYS ESD Downtown Revitalization Initiative (DRI) City Center Grant and the New York State Department of State DRI Grant for Harvester Theater 56; and

**WHEREAS**, \$40,000 will be used specifically for the Feasibility Study that will evaluate the potential for redevelopment of the City Centre site, while \$125,000 will aid in construction at City Center to include exterior façade work, silos, streetscape, awning improvements, as well as making 35 City Centre lease ready; and

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the City of Batavia City Council hereby authorize the City Manager of the City of Batavia, as the official representative of the City of Batavia, to accept and execute the grant agreement provided by National Grid on behalf of the City, to provide additional information or take action as may be required by the grant; and

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, the City Manager is hereby authorized to amend the 2019-2020 budget as set forth below effective August 12, 2019.
