TIP Grant Project Engineering Consultant Selection

The City of Batavia received notice of inclusion in the NYSDOT Region Four 2017/2020 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) this past June. The City application included a project to mill and resurface six streets within the City, and evaluate the applicability of bicycle lanes and ADA compliance of curbs ramps and sidewalks along these locations with a total project budget of \$2,550,463.

The next step in moving this project forward is the selection of a consulting engineer to perform the Scoping, Preliminary Design, Detailed Design, and Construction Services. The City sent requests for letters of interest to fifteen engineering firms which have received approval from NYSDOT Region Four as being qualified for this work (Region 4 LDSA List).

The City created an evaluation team to review the letters of interest from the eleven responding engineering firms and created a scoring system to determine the best consultant for the City on this project. This process also included involvement from a "Local Program Liaison" from NYSDOT to ensure the process was open and fair.

It is the recommendation of the evaluation team that Erdman Anthony Engineers be selected as the professional design consultant for the completion of this project. Erdman Anthony received the highest composite score of the evaluation team, and has an established track record with the City of being able to deliver this type of project. Erdman Anthony has provided a detailed contract proposal which, after review and adjustment, has been approved by NYSDOT as being appropriate.

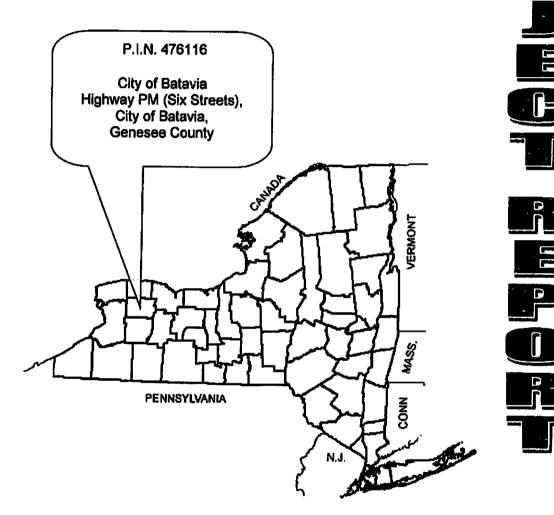

SPECIAL TECHNICAL ACTIVITES REQUIRED: A State-Local agreement will be required to allow for reimbursement of sponsor expenditures consistent with the applicable Federal Aid Program. A safety screening will be conducted during preliminary engineering.

PLANNED PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT: A Public Involvement Plan will be developed during preliminary engineering and will be implemented throughout final design and construction.

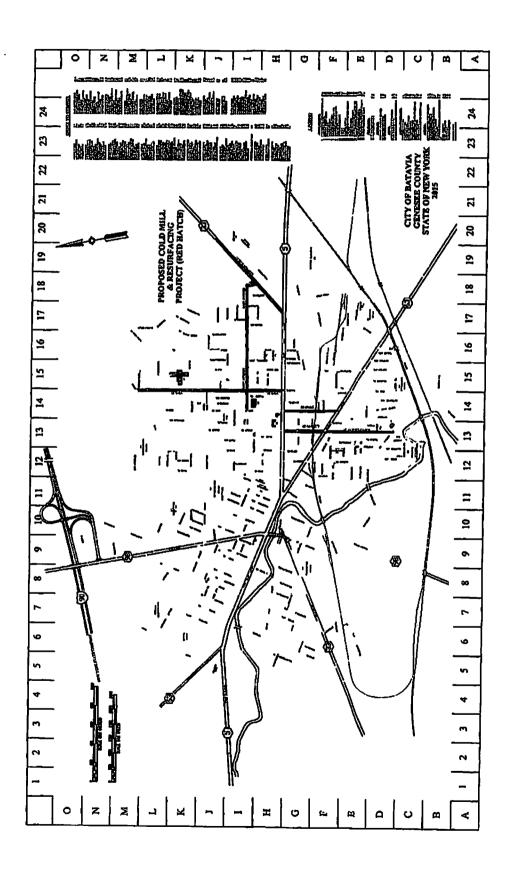
WORKZONE SAFETY & MOBILITY:

A Transportation Management Plan (TMP) will be prepared for the project consistent with 23 CFR 630.1012. The TMP will consist of a Temporary Traffic Control (TTC) plan. Transportation Operations (TO) and Public Information (PI) components of a TMP will be considered during final design.

PROBABLE SCHEDULE AND COST:

Consultant selection will start shortly and will be completed by fall 2016. Scoping/Preliminary Engineering will begin in October 2016. Final design will begin in October 2017. The PS&E will be produced in February 2018 for a bid opening in April 2018. The contract award and construction start will be in June 2018 and construction will be completed by November 2018. The estimated cost of engineering, construction and inspection is \$2,086,285.
