The GLOW YMCA and RRH/UMMC have petitioned the City of Batavia to rezone two parcels, 211 and 211 ½ East Main St., from a P2 (Planned Development) designation to a C-3 (Commercial) to erect the new Health Living Campus in downtown Batavia.

City Council sent the petitions to rezone 211 and 211 ½ East Main St. to the Planning and Development Committee (PDC) for review and recommendation. The PDC met and reviewed the petition for 211 East Main on May 18, 2021 and the petition for 211½ East Main on June 15, 2021, and recommended the rezoning of the properties from P-2 (Planned Development) to C-3 (Commercial).

The zoning change is consistent with the City's Comprehensive Plan adopted in 2017. The C-3 will best reflect and complement existing uses along Main St.

On August 8th 2021 the City Council will hold a public hearing on the matter and review SEQRA. After these reviews are satisfactorily concluded, I recommend that City Council approve the rezoning petitions for 211 and 211 ½ East Main St. to C-3 Commercial.





In the fall of 2018 the City of Batavia was awarded a \$10 Million Downtown Revitalization initiative (DRI) Grant for the City of Batavia. In the summer of 2019, specific projects were funded including the Jackson Square community gathering space project.

The project goals seek to enhance Jackson Square, a public gathering space bordered by historic buildings in the heart of downtown, with decorative pavement upgrades, a multi-level deck/stage, seating, lighting, decorative signage, a networking nook, and landscaping. The upgraded public plaza will become a lively hub and common space for community interaction, and provide connections to multiple businesses through its unique alleyway node configuration.

In the fall of 2020 the City choose Architectural Resources as the architect and engineer of record to advance the project from concept to construction. After multiple stakeholder meeting and public input sessions as well as feedback from the adjacent building owners and the Batavia Downtown Improvement District (BID) the design drawings are almost completed and construction is anticipated to begin at the end of October.

To this end, the City will complete a SEQR process and notify the Involved Interested Agencies of the City's intent to act as lead Agency under SEQR for this project.

GTC (Genesee Transportation Council) and NYSDOT (New York State Department of Transportation) has announced its call for project funding for the 2021 TAP. Tap grants are \$500 Thousand to \$5 million projects that are for the Planning, Design and Construction projects that address improvements to non-driver safety, access to public transit and enhance mobility. TAP Projects are eligible for up to 80% federal funding with a 20% Local Share Match. The City has used this funding successfully in the past, most recently the Pedestrian Way and Healthy Routes to Schools projects. This year we would like to submit for improvements for the area of Bank Street between Main Street and Washington Avenue.

Over the recent years, this area has been identified in both the DRI proposals and the City Centre Feasibility Studies to promote economic prosperity corridor to promote accessibility to downtown. This project would include traffic calming measures (streetscape elements, pavement markings and signage) and address pedestrian safety/ accessibility (Accessible ramps, relocation and added crosswalks, provide pedestrians corner bump outs and/or center median refuge). This is consistent with the City's Comprehensive plan to provide complete streets. We have currently engage LaBella Associates to prepare the necessary application for this project.
