WHEREAS, the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) in partnership with the New York State Department of State, is offering funding for economic development and infrastructure projects; and

WHEREAS, the City of Batavia is eligible to apply for CDBG grants; and

WHEREAS, the City of Batavia would like to apply for an infrastructure grant to upgrade water lines on Jackson Street; and

WHEREAS, the estimated cost of the project is \$1.36 million; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Manager of the City of Batavia, New York, is hereby authorized as the official representative of the City to execute and submit a Consolidated Funding Application for Community Development Block Grant funding to the administrative agency for the Fiscal Year 2021 program, all understandings and assurances contained therein, and is hereby directed and authorized to act in connection with the submission of the application and to provide such additional information as may be required.

Planning & Development Committee Recommendation 211 and 211 ½ East Main

City Council recently sent the petitions to rezone 211 and 211 ½ East Main St. to the Planning and Development Committee (PDC) for review and recommendation. The PDC met and reviewed the petition for 211 East Main on May 18, 2021 and the petition for 211½ East Main on June 15, 2021, and recommended the rezoning of the properties from P-2 (Planned Development) to C-3 (Commercial). The zoning change is consistent with the City's Comprehensive Plan adopted in 2017. The C-3 will best reflect and complement existing uses along Main St.

The letter from the PDC Chairman is included.

The petitions are now referred back to the City Council for consideration. A zoning change consists of a change to the zoning law, and therefore requires a public heading to receive public feedback prior to considering a local law adoption.

Based on the recommendation of the PDC I recommend that the City Council advance this to tonight's Business Meeting and set a Public Hearing for August 9, 2021.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 190 ENTITLED "ZONING" OF THE CITY OF BATAVIA MUNICIPAL CODE TO AMEND THE ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF BATAVIA

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT OF THE ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF BATAVIA TO REZONE PREMISES FROM A P-2 DISTRICT TO A C-3 DISTRICT.

All that tract or parcel of land situate in the City of Batavia, County of Genesee, State of New York, being part of Original Village Lot 26 and further described as follows.

Beginning at a point in the north bounds of East Main Street, said point being 78.29 feet westerly from the intersection of the north bounds of East Main Street with the west bounds of Wiard Street; thence

On September 22, 2020 the City Police were awarded \$32,981 from the Genesee County STOP-DWI program to provide for specialized patrols targeting drug and alcohol impaired driving, the purchase of equipment that will enhance DWI enforcement and training of personnel in specialized DWI enforcement methods for the calendar year of 2021.

The City of Batavia will benefit greatly from this STOP- DWI funding by enhancing the Police Department's ability to conduct more specialized enforcement details to target alcohol or drug impaired drivers.

WORKING AGREEMENT BATAVIA CITY POLICE DEPARTMENT

The Genesee County Special Traffic Options Program for Driving While Intoxicated (STOP-DWI) Program was established in 1982 for the purpose of developing a comprehensive county-wide program to combat drunk driving. A major function of this STOP-DWI Program is to coordinate the activities of the participating agencies in this effort, and to analyze their performance in accordance with the STOP-DWI philosophy and the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles Rules and Regulations.

The following is a cooperative agreement between Genesee County STOP-DWI Program and Batavia City Police Department. It will outline reporting procedures to be followed by Batavia City Police Department.

- A monthly report and voucher for reimbursement for services are due by the 10th of each month. (i.e. January 2021, report/voucher due date is February 10, 2021) If no activity has occurred, such should be indicated on the report form.
- Funds have been allocated in the amount of \$32,981 for the Law Enforcement component of the budget.

The Batavia Development Corporation (BDC) is desirous to apply for a 2021 Consolidated Funding Application (CFA) under the New York Main Street Technical Assistance grant program.

The grant, if received will be used to hire a design professional to prepare building reuse analysis, renderings, and cost estimates for the reuse and rehabilitation of 10 West Main Street, the Historic Brisbane Mansion, in order to prepare for a future New York Main Street building renovation grant

As you are aware, the City continues to move forward with siting a new police station at the North East corner of Alva and Bank Street, currently a City owned parking lot. As the project moves toward design, engineering and finally construction the BDC has expressed interest in helping ensure proper historical renovation and restoration of the Brisbane Mansion.

The strategy for disposing the property after vacancy is emerging and the building re-use analysis will be beneficial for the City to solicit a private developer to the property for acquisition, rehabilitation and eventual return to the tax rolls.

The project known as the Police Station Flat Roof Replace involves the work necessary to replace the flat roof portions of the current police station at 10 West Main Street. The roof sections are over the 1960's addition and over the rear vestibule. The existing roof is 31 years old and has had numerous repairs. The roof is no longer waterproof and the insulation is saturated.
